Greetings from the Loft! We have been very busy in our environment for the past 6 weeks, welcoming friends both old and new, learning names and faces, and building the foundation of our peaceful classroom. I can honestly say that your children are very happy to be at school, and Samantha and I feel the same way! Our focus during those first few weeks was getting to know one another, as well as feeling comfortable speaking in front of the group. We have several songs that we are singing daily in order to provide that consistency children crave at this age. Learning the days of the week has been most enjoyable thanks to a book by Eric Carle called *Today is Monday*. The children anticipate it with pure joy each and every day.

We started the year with an introduction to the earth in order to celebrate several birthdays. The child holds the globe as he or she makes his way around the sun, demonstrating how many years he or she has been alive. This led into a discussion about the four seasons which we continue to talk about on a daily basis. Next, we had an introduction to the seven continents. Please ask them to sing the continent song for you! We talked about the composition of the earth being land and water, and discussed the habitats of many animals we might see in both. Next came the solar system. The children have been VERY excited discussing the planets, and learning many distinguishable facts about them. And yes, there is another song which I hope you have all heard by now.

As we get further into fall we have included apples and pumpkins throughout several areas of the environment. The art and practical life shelves have been extremely popular with this group. Samantha and I love to see their concentration and creativity shine! We will begin studying each continent separately now beginning with North America. Did they tell you about the yesterday's ship building experiment? We discussed Christopher Columbus's voyage , and then constructed ships which we then "sailed" right in our classroom. Everyone was so excited! In fact, we have been doing science experiments weekly, and they are always a hit. We will be talking a lot about the Pilgrims and Native Americans in the coming weeks in anticipation of Thanksgiving. I hope to do some cooking in the classroom too.

Samantha and I truly love working together, and we feel so lucky to have your kids with us each day. Thank you for your continued support and of course for entrusting us with your children. We feel as though our class has already made great strides to come together as friends and as a nice cohesive group. We look forward to what the future holds in store for us all in the coming months as our class continues to grow.

Students ended their land and water form studies



First, second, and third graders continue learning about time and how it relates to them. The earth spinning on its axis, orbiting the sun, years, seasons, months and days are all important lessons to help students understand time. Next, we will be using timelines in relation to ancient civilizations and famous people in history.

Upper Elementary

Upper Elementary students are enjoying playing golf in this beautiful fall weather at First Tee of Canton and outside at the Annex, too! Students are practicing their short game by learning to putt, chip and pitch.

Students are hard at work in our Science Lab with 6th graders learning how to identify Rocks and Minerals, 5th graders learning about Centripetal and Centrifugal Force, and 4th graders making OObleck and exploring the properties of liquids and solids.

Students have grade-level History lessons, too. Sixth grade students are studying the Ancient civilizations of the Eastern Hemisphere such as Mesopotamia, India, Ancient Egypt, Ancient Japan, Ancient Africa, and the Greeks and Romans. Fifth grade students are learning about Ancient American Civilizations and American Indians of the Western Hemisphere. Fourth grade students study famous people, geography and history of the State of Ohio. We are also using our Montessori math materials to learn 2-digit divisor long division and using the Cubing materials to construct a 3-dimensional representation of a Trinomial Equation.

The structure of our classroom allows each student to work at their level and at their own pace with no limits on how far they can progress. We are so proud of our students and their courage to challenge themselves academically!
