




The Ballroom






The Parlor



Upper Elementary Endeavors

Do you see one of the Upper Elementary students with a tower made of natural wood that resembles the pink tower found in the Pre-primary classrooms? Our tower is called the Biosphere Nesting Box and it illustrates the "systems thinking" approach of how life is structured and connected. The 10 boxes go from the whole (the Universe) to the various parts that create the framework of Life Science. The boxes start with the Milky Way Galaxy, the solar system, the biosphere, its biomes, ecosystems, population of plants and animals, individuals and their tissues, organs, cells, and, finally, the atom. Students have been studying important concepts and information at each level. Sixth year students have been learning about the parts of the plant cell using 3 part cards to learn the functions of the cell parts and to create booklets for recording that information. Fourth and fifth year students are learning the different land and water biomes of Earth using the Biome Decagon. They will also create a colored, biome map of each continent using stencils. We love the depth of our Life Science curriculum and the unique materials that keep our students engaged.

9 - 12 year old students are never too old to enjoy the first snow of the season! They love to build snowmen, ride sleds, build snow castles and make snow angels. Last Friday's 50 degree temperatures had our students organizing a game of Sharks and Minnows in our green space. <u>Every</u> student is encouraged and welcomed to participate in daily recess games. It never fails to warm my heart to witness their kindness and cooperation.

Check our latest Physical Education highlights below:

Lower Elementary:

-reinforced our understanding of the food chain, the Timeline of Life, and the Second Great Lesson as students were either orcas or seals with *"Shelter"*

-continued our study of the Timeline of Life with *"Timeline of Life Animal Movements"* where each student was able to choose the animal they would be in a relay race. Students chose to be a representation of one of the following: Trilobite, Cephalopod, Ostracoderm, Eurypterid, Dunkleosteus, Tetrapod, Dimetrodon, Theropod, Brachiosaurus, or chose to be a Devil Frog, Saber Tooth Cat, or Wooly Mammoth.

-introduced the Italian game of "Bocce" or "Lawn Bowling"

Upper Elementary:

-with the "Adaptation Mutation Obstacle Course", we were able to demonstrate how beneficial mutations become adaptions, which aid in survival.

-we continued our study of the theory and practice of basketball through "Government Basketball". To reinforce concepts on government types and styles, teams competed as one of the following governmental types that originate from these three government styles: Capitalistic, Socialistic, or Communistic. The types were: Autocracy, Oligarchy, Republic, Democracy, and Anarchy
