We can leave them at school and send them home on the weekend each week. We will be going outside EVERYDAY as long as the wind chill temperature is above 20 degrees.

The students studied various body parts, the circulatory system, and various bones throughout the month of November. They learned about the importance and function of each part. They also used their five senses to explore objects and activities. They learned how their senses interact with one another.

The different food groups were covered with the students during the month of December (grains, vegetables, fruits, dairy, and protein). They discovered that consuming a variety of foods from each food group would help them develop and provide them with the energy they need.

Additionally, the students studied and traveled through Europe. They looked at images from several countries and learned about their monuments, wildlife, and cultures. The other countries' names and locations were also taught to them.

As December came to a close, we began studying the five animal kingdoms. The students discovered that they are mammals, and the characteristics of a mammal include hair or fur, being warm-blooded, being born alive, drinking mother's milk, and having vertebrates. Additionally, they studied the characteristics of reptiles which include vertebrates covered with scales, cold-blooded, produce shelled eggs, or bear live young and have at least one lung.





Lower Elementary

A Lower Elementary Thanksgiving tradition is to make stone soup the week before Thanksgiving. Students are invited to bring in one ingredient to share. They prepare the veggies and enjoy hearing the story Stone Soup read by Mrs. Chandler, and then we all try our delicious soup at the end of the day!





Upper Elementary

The Upper Elementary students have been working on Advanced Solar System Studies this month. While using hands-on materials and technology, they have worked with partners on the following topics:

- Understanding day and night, the "apparent" movement of the sun, the differences of time on Earth, the length of a shadow, and the reason for the seasons using the Tellurium. The Tellurium is a model used to demonstrate the movement of the earth and moon around the sun.
- Studying the orbits of the planets using the Solar System Mat.
- Understanding how gravity on different planets affects weight using the Gravity Bottles. The Gravity Bottles allow children to feel the weight of equal mass on each planet and the moon. The students then weigh themselves and calculate their weight on each planet, the moon, and the sun!
- Identifying constellations in the northern and southern hemispheres by their scientific name and nickname using the Constellation Board.
- Calculating the distance of planets in relation to each other and the sun using Astronomical Units of measurement.



Upper Elementary continued



- Solar System Research using command cards that prompt children to explore the workings of the Solar System and the relationships between its parts. For example, students will research how many times faster does Earth rotate than Mars or how much colder is Neptune's "surface temperature" than Earth's lowest surface temperature?
- Studying the Birth of the Universe Timeline from the Plank Epoch to the Formation of Galaxies. Students can view a stunning visual representation of the timeline while learning the terminology of the timeline.

Thank you to all of our Upper Elementary families who offered to help during our Wonka Kids Set Decoration Night on Thursday, December 8th. We had such an overwhelming response that we will need to schedule other dates so we can complete the set before our Wonka Kids Musical on Thursday, January 12th. We are painting backdrops under the artistic direction of Holly Brothers (Addy's mom) with Rachel Ranalli (Sophia's mom), Shannon McFee (Kyran's mom), and Mhari Weir (a former CMS student). We appreciate all your time and talent and look forward to doing it again!

Upper Elementary students have acted as instructors, helping small groups of Lower Elementary students create the crafts that will be sold.


















