Lower Elementary

The Lower Elementary students continued their cultural studies in the areas of Zoology, Geography, Social Studies, and Botany. Students in grades one to three are drawn to these subjects, and thus they provide ample opportunities for reading, research, and critical thinking skill-building in our Montessori Environments.











Upper Elementary

After our Willy Wonka Kids performance in January, Upper Elementary students were inspired to do their own Broadway Musical research. Aladdin, Annie, The Lion King, Hamilton, and Phantom of the Opera were just a few of the musicals researched. Students dressed in a costume from their musical, made a diorama of a scene, created a musical poster and a slideshow presentation using Google Slides.

Upper Elementary students chose books (donated by our generous parents) for Literature Circle groups. Students are reading Walk Two Moons by Sharon Creech, PAX by Sara Pennypacker, and Wonder by R.J. Palacio. Every Monday morning, we meet to discuss last week's chapters. As a group, we decide how much we are going to read, and we write about what we have read in our reading response journals. It's important to come to our group ready to discuss!

Upper Elementary learned about the steadily increasing number sequence known as the Fibonacci Sequence. Students found examples of the Fibonacci Sequence in nature, art, and architecture. On March 14th (or 3.14), we explored the ratio of the circumference of a circle to the diameter of that circle, known as Pi. We measured and calculated the circumference and area of a circle. Students challenged themselves to memorize the digits of the irrational number that is Pi. Theo was able to memorize 120 digits of Pi and was crowned the King of Pi for the day! No Pi Day is complete without enjoying a piece of pie for dessert!
